The young alumni do a community service event at the homeless shelter once a month on a Sunday and jointly attend the University of Michigan's Student Parish for a dorm style mass afterwards. The Club sponsors a clothing drive collecting coats for children and the collection of food at a Club mass.

They also have an active TAP program chaired by John Freitas, now the NDSA senior coordinator.

Their biggest success was partnering with a community organization called HOPE – which runs a number of facilities to serve the poor.
