



## NOTRE DAME CLUB SENIOR ALUMNI COORDINATOR

Most members of the Notre Dame Senior Alumni Board (NDSA) have been active in Club leadership positions. Based on our Club and professional experiences, we believe that there are vital and significant roles which senior members can fill in our Clubs and that there are many seniors available and willing to do so. NDSA stands ready to help Club leaders identify ND seniors in their areas whose skills, networks, and resources can be put to good use on behalf of their Clubs and their communities.

NDSA suggests that many Clubs will be able to create the position of Senior Alumni Coordinator to assist Club leadership in mobilizing local senior participation. Some, or all, of the characteristics listed below could describe your Senior Alumni Coordinator position:

- A recognized, prominent Club position: designated by the Club's Board, serves as an active member of the Club's Board of Directors, ensures inclusion of a senior perspective in Club management. A respected leader and motivator in the Club and the local community, the individual would most likely, but not necessarily, be at least 55 years old.
- A person dedicated to working with other Board Members, the Club President, and the Club Membership Chairman to identify and reintroduce seniors to their Club, encouraging their active membership and participation.
- An organizer and sponsor of Club activities ranging from administration to camaraderie to Catholic Spirituality that will be of interest and challenging to Club seniors
- A promoter for national NDSA and local Club Initiatives
- A person to seek out and identify local Notre Dame Alumni currently involved in effective volunteer activities which could be expanded to include participation by Club members, especially other seniors
- A participant at Club Board Meetings, and possibly at AA Board Regional Meetings and the Annual Senate
- A communicator with the responsibility of reporting Club senior activities to NDSA and receiving from NDSA (and Senior Alumni Coordinators in other Clubs) information on successful activities elsewhere which might work well in the local Club.
